Historical context

Michel Barcelo (1938-2013), a Montreal urban planner, was also a watercolorist. A graduate in architecture from the École d'architecture de Montréal, he was a long-time employee of the Ville de Montréal before becoming professor of architecture at the Université de Montréal's Faculté d'aménagement. He learned painting from his uncle, Marc-Aurèle Fortin. His profession led him to appreciate cities and their layout: he wanted to capture the unique personality of Montreal's streets. Here, the watercolor depicts a row of residences on Saint-Denis Street, in the Plateau-Mont-Royal borough. Because they are set back from the street, these houses feature a front garden area, often wooded. The combination of this green space and the exterior iron staircases gives these Plateau-Mont-Royal rows a unique style that Barcelo has faithfully reproduced.
