The plate is complete. It is circular with a plain rim. On the front, the marli is narrow and flat, and the low wall curves towards the flat bottom. On the reverse, the plate has a large, flat bottom, dented in places, a slightly beveled rim, a low wall and a rounded marli. The reverse glaze is pitted with a few small holes. The body is beige, and the object is covered with a bluish-white

enamel. There are three pernette marks in a triangular pattern on the reverse. The enamel is shiny. There are numerous wear marks on the base. The enamel around the rim has partially disappeared; The decoration is hand-painted in cobalt blue, underglaze. It is floral and geometric. The decoration is found on both the rim and the base. The decoration on the marli consists of a wide solid band, on which a wavy line has been incised with a tool to highlight the background. The background is decorated with a large flower surrounded by leafy stems in an area of the background near the edge; the perimeter of the background is decorated with three long stylized leafy stems, and a small leafy stem near the center.
