

Contexte historique

Situé au coin des rues Atwater et Sainte-Catherine, le Forum de Montréal est l'aréna emblématique du Club de hockey Canadien, où l'équipe de hockey professionnelle a connu ses plus belles heures de gloire. Il est inauguré le 29 novembre 1924 et servira d'amphithéâtre à la Sainte-Flanelle jusqu'en 1996, année où l'équipe déménage au Centre Molson, qui deviendra le Centre Bell par la suite.

Au cours du 20^e siècle, l'édifice a aussi abrité des événements sportifs divers comme la boxe, la lutte, la gymnastique, le tennis et d'autres disciplines. Pour faire la promotion de ces événements, l'institution montréalaise a publié son propre magazine durant quelques années.

Cette copie date de 1938 et coûtait 10 cents à l'époque. Ce numéro fait notamment la promotion de la célèbre course de Six Jours, une compétition internationale de cyclisme se déroulant au Forum.

En 1997, le Forum de Montréal est reconnu comme lieu historique national du Canada pour son rôle en tant qu'installation sportive renommée et pour ses liens étroits avec les Canadiens de Montréal et la culture du hockey au sein du peuple canadien.
